Thank you so much for your interest in the 2024 FamilyU Cohort!

The FamilyU Cohort is a comprehensive, customized, evidence-based, two-year capacity-building experience designed to create and refine institutional competencies to improve undergraduate student parent success. In partnership with institutional staff and student parents, colleges and universities participate in peer learning convenings and campus-focused independent coaching sessions.

Through FamilyU, partner institutions will fundamentally shift the higher education system for student parents by:

- Improving data collection methods and tools to better track the parenting status of your students.
- Increasing awareness of the student parent population enrolled at your institution and their needs for college completion by cultivating student parent champions at your institution to galvanize systems-change efforts.
- Boosting student enrollment, retention, and completion rates at your institution by developing and implementing racially equitable, parent-friendly policies at all levels on your campus to help students thrive.
- Deepening relationships with peer institutions and field experts working to improve student outcomes.

Through the application process, we will select five institutions to engage in this unique capacity-building opportunity. A few reminders before completing the application:

- Applications are due on May 3, 2024 by 11:59 PM EST.
- This application will take approximately 15 minutes to complete not including submitting supplemental documents. Once you begin the application, you may save and come back, if needed.
- Only one application per institution will be accepted.
- Each institution must designate a FamilyU Point of Contact (lead) who is authorized to complete and submit the application on behalf of the institution. The point of contact will field all correspondence related to the FamilyU Cohort and will identify team members from the identified functional areas.
- Ensure that you have reviewed the PDF version of the FamilyU Cohort Application and the FAQ before beginning your application.
- Each institution will be required to pay \$10,000 *per year* to participate, with the first payment due by June 30, 2024. *Please note that this fee will be waived for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).*
  - **UPDATE as of 3/22/24:** In addition to this annual fee, **each institution will be responsible for covering their team members' lodging and travel costs for convenings.** (*Lodging and airfare will be covered for one HBCU*)
- Institutions will be notified of selection by late May 2024.

Q1: To be eligible for the FamilyU Cohort, prospective institutions must meet all of the following criteria. Please check each box to indicate your institution meets these criteria.

- Be a non-profit, post-secondary education institution (including public, private, 2-year, and 4-year institutions).
- Be located in the United States.
- Have a demonstrated interest in serving the undergraduate student parent population enrolled at your institution.
- Have a demonstrated commitment to racially-equitable practices at your institution.
- Be amenable to data sharing with the larger student-parent field.
- Have a committed group of student parent champions who are willing to serve on the institutional team as a part of the FamilyU Cohort. This commitment will require multi-day travel to various cities throughout the United States. Participating Institutions will cover expenses related to their team's lodging, air travel, and ground transportation.
- Have the support of institutional leadership.
